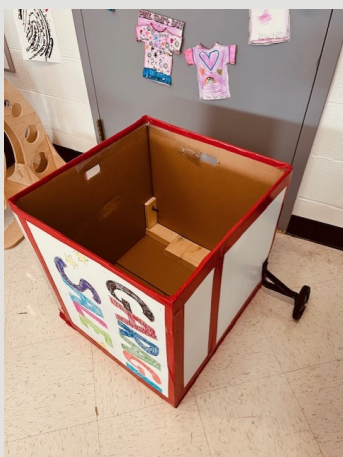

THE CHALLENGE
