




We are pleased to welcome Mr. Mikolas Mykietyshyn, to the Grade 3A classroom while Mr. Cabral is on a leave.



- Demonstrates precision and/or creativity in applying skills and strategies between concepts to approach new learning situations

#### PROFICIENT STANDARD (PF)

- Demonstrates a comprehensive and/or thoughtful understanding of the learning outcomes from the program of studies
- Applies concepts in learning situations intentionally and/or logically and can routinely transfer understanding to new contexts
- Demonstrates flexibility and/or purpose in applying skills and strategies to approach new learning situations

#### ACCEPTABLE STANDARD (AS)

- Demonstrates a rudimentary and/or satisfactory understanding of the learning outcomes from the program of studies

#### **Learner Skills - DRAFT**

This year, parents will see a return of learner skills focusing on three key categories: Citizenship, Collaboration, and Self Management.

- Citizenship reflects the student as a member of our Catholic school community,
- Collaboration reflects the student's participation as a group member working towards learning goals, and
- *Self-Management* reflects the student's responsibility for personal learning.


Specific learner skills, selected under the three key categories, are chosen intentionally and personally for each student, to highlight their individual strengths and identify areas of growth. Teachers will assess all learner skills over the course of the year and use the following indicators to report on the student's progress within these skills:

- Shows Consistently: the student demonstrates that he or she possess and is exemplifying the particular skill on a habitual (regular, ongoing) basis.
- Shows Progress: the student is growing on the continuum in their development of this skill.
- Requires Growth: the student has not yet demonstrated sufficient evidence of the particular ski

These learner skills will appear on the January and June report cards and will be discussed with parents in November and March at the demonstrations of learning/conferences.

#### Introduction

Catholic Social Teaching is a central and essential element of our faith. Its roots are in the Hebrew prophets who announced God's special love for the poor and called God's people to a covenant of love and justice. It is a teaching founded on the life and words of Jesus Christ, who came "to bring glad tidings to the poor . . . liberty to captives . . . recovery of sight to the blind" (Luke 4:18-19), and who identified himself with "the least of these," the hungry and the stranger (Matthew 25:45). Indeed, our commitment to the Catholic social mission of the Church must be rooted in and strengthened by our spiritual lives. In our relationship with God, we experience the conversion of heart that is necessary to truly love one another as God has loved us.

Edmonton Catholic Schools has a long and proud tradition of participation in acts of Christian charity that can be associated with the five stages of social justice as outlined by author Constance Fourre in her book *Journey to Justice*, which has been a guiding document for us. Schools are encouraged to take their children through a broad range of activities that allow them to experience the many ways that they can make a difference in the world. Indeed, when we consider the Five Marks of Catholic School Identity, our acts of social justice provide a visible and tangible embodiment of our Catholic worldview.


Stage One: Collections – bring a relief of immediate needs

Stage Two: Direct Service - directly filling needs in the community

Stage Three: Service for Empowerment - empowering people for lasting change

Stage Four: Reflection and Analysis

Stage Five: Advocacy for Structural Change
