## 5. Principal's Report (Administration Report):

- School Theme: This year's book is <u>"Come With Me" by Holly M. McGhee</u>, focusing on the link between bravery and hope.
- Division Plan: Year 3 of the Division Plan for Continuous Growth. A new plan will be developed with input from School Councils at COSC on November 18.
- School Priorities ("Big Rocks"): Mental Health and Wellness, Professional Learning, Living our Faith, Assessment, Literacy and Numeracy, Gifted and Talented Education (GATE). Planning for next year has begun.
- Enrolment: 225 students (254 including 100 Voices at the Zoo). 36 students in GATE.
- Assessment: Assignments will be posted in <u>PowerSchool</u> throughout the year, not just final marks. Parents encouraged to review achievement criteria.

- KCJ asked for feedback about continuing with printing paper copies.SAC recommends printing January and June summary reports.
- Communication: Friday emails will continue in 2025-2026, now shorter based on parent feedback. Friday folders will go home 1–2 times per month. Follow St. Paul on Instagram @st.paul ecsd.

- School Budget: Last year's deficit was just over \$54,000; expecting improvement this year.
